

## Head of Campus Report

### Welcome back

Welcome back to term 3. I hope you had a chance to enjoy some family time over the school holidays. This term is a busy one. With so many events and opportunities for our students and a lot to organise, I ask that we all make a determined effort to return all correspondence to the office as soon as possible after distribution.

### Covey's 5<sup>th</sup> Habit

I am continuing this term with a summary of the Habits of Highly Effective Families from Stephen Covey's book. The next habit to look at is:

*Habit 5 - Seek First to Understand: Then to be Understood.* The essence of this habit is empathy. If we make a determined effort to deeply listen and understand other family members, we see things from their perspective. Covey highlights that the deepest hunger of the human heart is to be understood and that there's no way to have rich, rewarding family relationships without real understanding. He also explores *that most mistakes with family members are not the result of bad intent. It's just that we don't understand. We don't see clearly into one another's hearts.* This is certainly a challenge in busy family life, but it's important.

### Campus Improvements

Our pavers are now in place after our 'lay a paver day' on the last day of term. Improvements continued over the holidays with Rob Blackmore building another circular seat near our campus entrance and Mark Jenkins building an end-wall on the 'Apple Grove' area. These improvements continue to improve the aesthetics of the place and pride we all have in our amazing campus.

### Book Week

Our celebrations for this year will be a little disjointed due to camp, but we still have many events planned. After the success of Pyjama stories last year, we will do them again on Monday week 5, with more Book Week activities taking place in week 6. The culmination of all of these celebrations will be our parade and Community Day on Friday of week 6.

# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

## WELCOME BACK

While the Winter weather has certainly arrived of late, I would like to extend a warm welcome back to all members of our school community for third term. A special welcome goes to a number of new students and their families who have just joined our school in the last fortnight and also to a number of staff members who have returned from various forms of leave.

## PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

We had a most productive day of professional learning for all EFS staff on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> July. Our expert presenter was Sheena Cameron who is a highly regarded teacher, author and consultant from New Zealand, whose area of expertise is in the areas of reading, comprehension and vocabulary. Sheena was able to provide both strong affirmation and extension of the approaches we have been adopting across our school in recent years. Our teachers and classroom based SSO's were clearly engaged and quite positive about the day led by Sheena and organised so capably by Vikki McInnes. The SSO's involved with administration also met in the morning and we discussed where we are up to with our review of our current structure. Tony Robinson has been appointed as the new SSO5 Business Manager, while Becky Hawkey's new role will see her coordinating assets and maintenance.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Five new international students joined us at the 7-12 campus and all bar one will be here for the remainder of 2017. All of these students are in Year 11 with three of them coming from Italy, one from Germany and one from Belgium. The students are staying with host families and have already been warmly welcomed by their new EFS peers. Later this term we will again be hosting a two week visit from 15 Japanese students and

their teachers and we are also very much looking forward to this experience. Having these students from various countries spending time with us is enriching and rewarding for both the visitors and our own students.

## BUSES AND BUILDINGS

We are closely monitoring the numbers on the two Goolwa buses as we continue to take new enrolments for 2018. At this stage there are about eight more seats available but I expect these will be gone before early Term 4 at the latest. We have also been having conversations with the new DECD Chief Executive and the Facilities Manager about the status of the two double demountable classrooms we require at the two Strathalbyn campuses.

## VISIT FROM NEW EFS PRINCIPAL


# CHILDREN'S BOOK WEEK 2017

The campus will be covering the cost of this session.




**Monday, 21<sup>st</sup> August** – Pyjama Stories – Wear your pyjamas and hear some of the staff's favourite books!

## Bubblegum Portraits


We drew a self portrait and used oil pastels to colour it in. then we painted the outside blue. We blew up some balloons to make it look like we are blowing bubblegum.



## L e m o n c u r d t a r t l e t s

- 1 1/2 sheets frozen ready rolled shortcrust pastry, partially thawed
- 1 egg
- 1 egg yolk
- 1/3 cup caster sugar
- 1 tspn finely grated lemon rind
- 2 Tblspns lemon juice
- 50 g butter, chopped
- Finely grated lemon rid to serve



**LEMON CURD**  
Place egg, egg yolk, sugar, lemon rind & juice in a heavy saucepan, whisk to combine, add butter. Place over medium heat, cook whisking for 7-8 minutes or until mixture coats back of a spoon, remove from heat, stand for 5 minutes. Pour into a small bowl. Cover surface with plastic wrap & set aside to cool.

**BASES**  
lightly grease a 12 hole mini muffin tray. Using a 6.5 cm cutter, cut 12 rounds from pastry. Press pastry rounds into prepared pan, pierce bases with a fork. & freeze for 10 to 15 minutes or until firm. Preheat oven to 180°C/ 160°C for fan forced. Bake cases for 15 to 16 minutes or until light golden. Cool in pan for 10 minutes, transfer to cooling rack.  
Spoon 2 1/2 teaspoons of lemon curd in each pastry case, top with lemon rind and serve.
